Wilbur and Orville Wright flew their first airplane here at Huffman Prairie, which is now a national historical landmark. If you are looking for aviation heritage, look no further than Greene County. All within just a few miles, you can visit the National Museum of the United States Air Force, Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park, Huffman Prairie Flying Field and Interpretive Center, the Wright Brothers Memorial, and Wright State University Archives which contains the most complete collection of Wright brothers items.

Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park

The human imagination found its highest expression in three men from Dayton, Ohio: **Wilbur and Orville Wright**, first to fly a powered, heavier-than-air machine and creators of the practical airplane, and **Paul Laurence Dunbar**, who with his compelling new voice was the first African American writer to win high distinction in American literature. Dayton Aviation Heritage commemorates the lives and legacies of these three exceptional men and the history of aviation. The park is a cooperative effort between the National Park Service and four partners. nps.gov/index.htm

Huffman Prairie Flying Field (FREE)

Huffman Prairie Flying Field, a national historic landmark, is located at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base in Greene County. This 84-acre pasture is where Wilbur and Orville Wright undertook the difficult and dangerous task of creating a dependable, fully controllable airplane and training themselves to be pilots. The field looks just as it did when the Wright brothers flew here in 1904. **(937) 225-7705, Enter through Gate 16A, WPAFB, Ohio 45433**

Huffman Prairie Flying Field Interpretive Center (FREE)

The Huffman Prairie Interpretive Center exhibits focus on the Wright brothers' experimental flights at Huffman Prairie Flying Field in 1904 and 1905, and on The Wright Company's flying school from 1910 to 1916. The Interpretive Center also covers the history of Wright-Patterson Air Force Base from its beginnings at McCook Field in Dayton during World War I, up to its contributions to the aerospace projects of the future now being carried out at its current complex, which includes the Huffman Prairie Field where Wilbur and Orville Wright turned their invention into a practical machine. **(937) 425-0008, 2380 Memorial Road, WPAFB (Off Route 444)**

Wright Brothers Memorial

The Memorial is located at the top of Wright Brothers Hill, overlooking the Huffman Prairie Flying Field. A plaque on the low stone wall surrounding the plaza around the Memorial lists the names of the 119 pilots trained at Huffman Prairie. The Memorial was erected by the citizens of Dayton to honor Wilbur and Orville Wright for their original aeronautical research. **(937) 425-0008, 2380 Memorial Road, WPAFB (Off Route 444)**

Wright State University Archives

Wright State University is named in honor of Wilbur and Orville Wright. The Archives contain the most complete collection of Wright brothers items, including about 4,000 photographs that document the invention of the airplane or pertain to the Wright family. The Archives also include many other aviation collections, all of which are available to researchers with advance notification. A full-scale replica of the Wright brothers' 1903 airplane hangs from the ceiling of the Library's atrium and selected items from the Archives' Wright Brothers Collection are on display in the Library Reading Room. **(937) 775-2092, 3640 Colonel Glenn Highway, Fairborn**

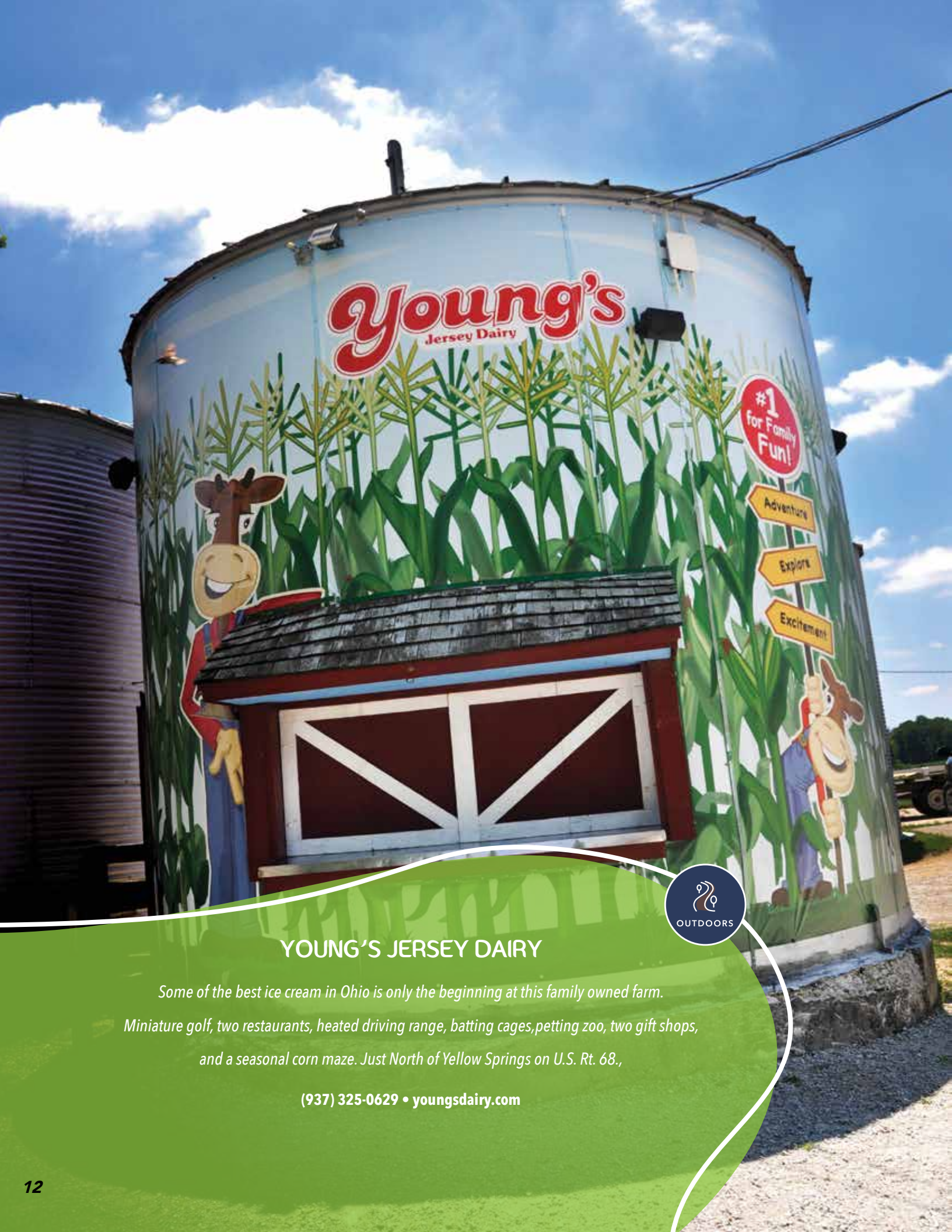


Greene County Historical Society

Kil-Kare Dragway

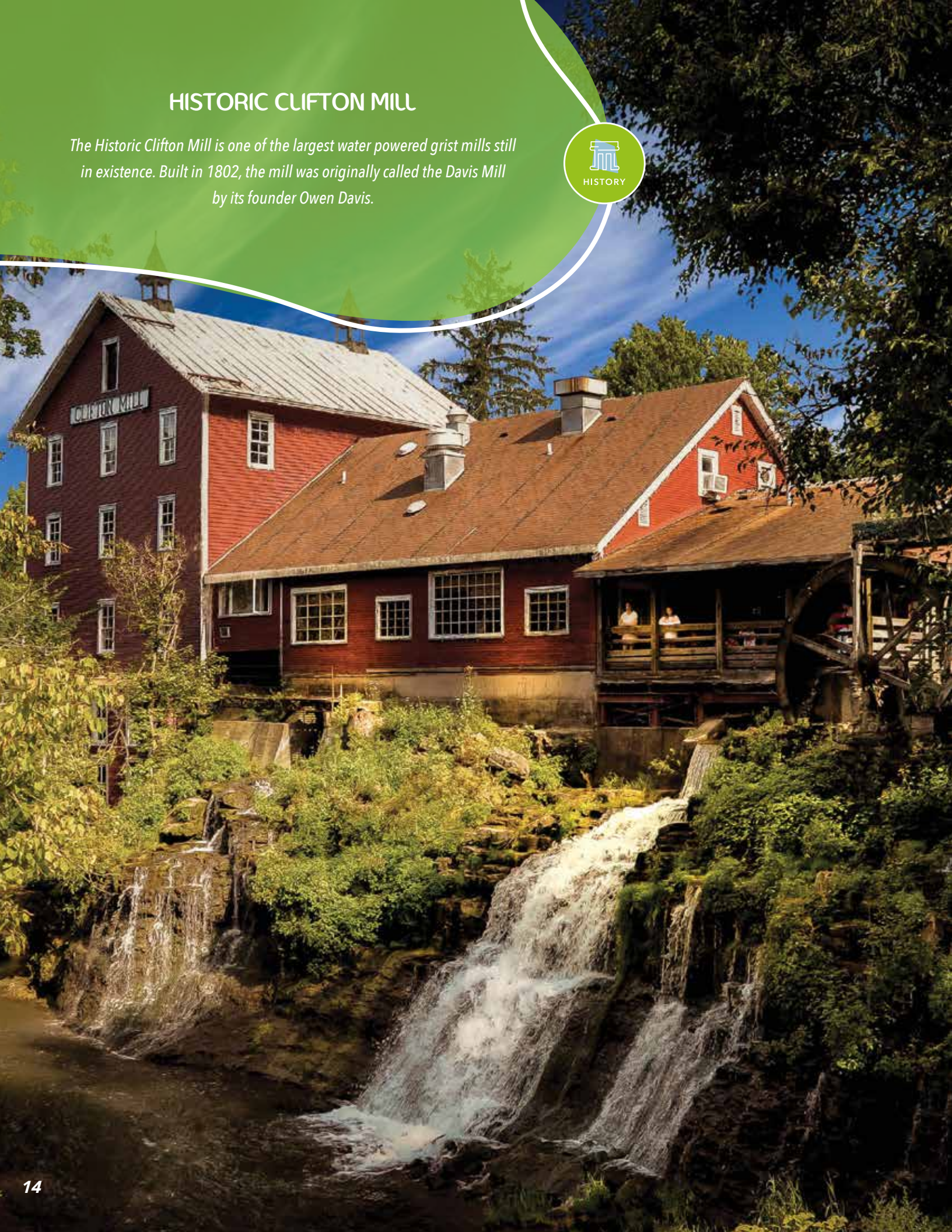

HISTORIC CLIFTON MILL

The Historic Clifton Mill is one of the largest water powered grist mills still in existence. Built in 1802, the mill was originally called the Davis Mill by its founder Owen Davis.

Historic Clifton Mill

The Historic Clifton Mill was built in this location to take advantage of the natural power of the concentrated water funneled from the Little Miami River into the Clifton Gorge. The Satariano family purchased the mill in 1987 and continue to preserve its historical integrity. Today, you can still see the mill operate, converting natural water power into energy. Tour the facility to see early machinery, and see how stones are used to grind grain into flour. A visit to historic Clifton Mill is truly an educational experience that you and your family will long remember.

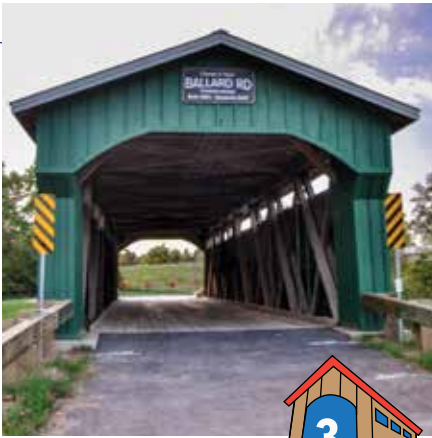

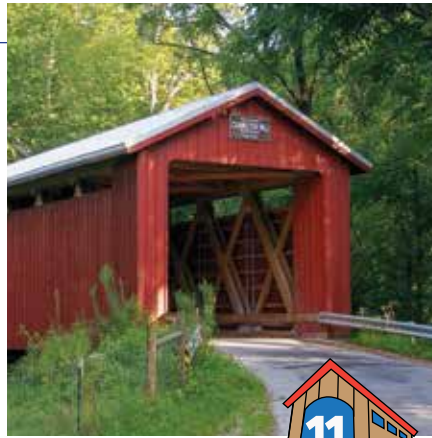
OUR COVERED BRIDGES

Although the roof over the covered bridge is what sets it apart from other bridges, the trusses are what distinguish one covered bridge from another. A truss is a frame containing beams and braces arranged in triangular shapes. This arrangement of triangles allows each brace to support the other and working together they support whatever weight is placed upon the bridge.



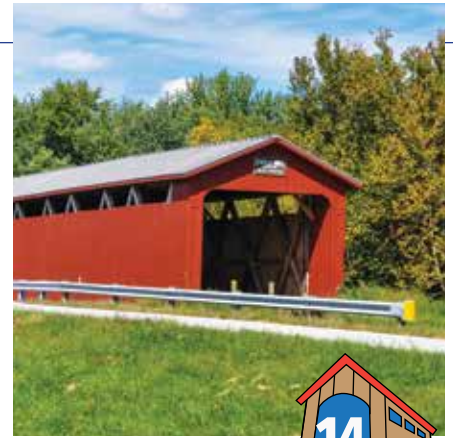
Ballard Road Bridge #3

Spanning Caesar Creek north branch, the bridge was built in 1883 by J.C. Brown using Howe trusses. The overall length is 80 feet with a clear span of 73 feet. H.E. Hebble was the mason on this bridge and Brown did the superstructure. This is one of the loveliest covered bridges in Ohio.



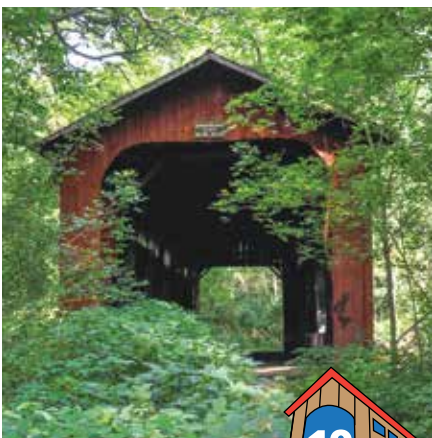
Charleton Mill Road Bridge #11

This bridge was built over Massie's Creek in 1883 by Henry E. Hebble using Howe trusses. The overall length is 128 feet with a clear span of 120 feet. Major repairs were required in 1969 when a truck loaded with gravel attempted to cross the bridge and caused the floor to give way. There are now steel I-beams under the floor. Currently a working bridge to automobile traffic.



Engle Road Bridge #14

Spanning Anderson's Fork, it was built in 1887 by the Smith Bridge Co. with Smith trusses. The overall length is 148 feet with a clear span of 136. Engle Road Bridge has been taken out of service and is now a drive-by bridge with off road parking for visitors to stop and get a closer look at this restored structure.



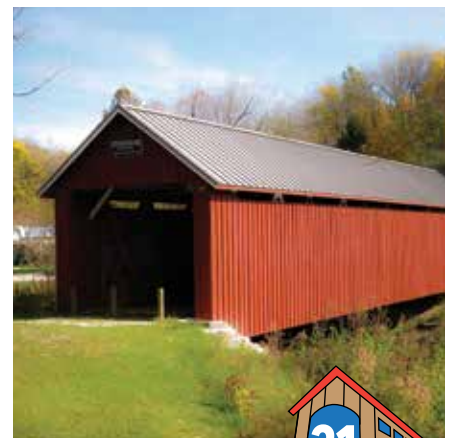
Grinnell Road Bridge #18

Previously called the Cemetery Road Bridge, it originally spanned Anderson's Fork. It was built in 1886 by Henry E. Hebble using Howe trusses with turnbuckles on the iron rods that could be tightened. The overall length was 130 feet with a clear span of 126 feet. In 1979 the 60 foot center section was moved from Cemetery Road to Glen Helen Nature Reserve. The bridge is no longer in use and is accessible by a foot path from Grinnell Road.



Richard P. Eastman Hyde Road Bridge #28

The Richard P. Eastman Hyde Road covered bridge in Yellow Springs is named in honor of Dick Eastman who was the Greene County Engineer from 1974 through 1996. The new structure is a 77 foot span Howe Truss, which was a popular design in the mid-to-late 1800's.



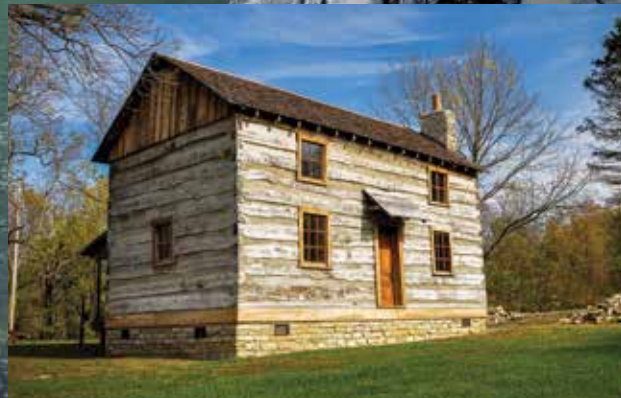
Stevenson Road Bridge #31

Also known as Whiteman's Bridge and the Wright Bridge, it spans Massie's Creek. It was built in 1877 by Smith Bridge Co. using Smith double trusses. The overall length is 99 feet with a clear span of 95 feet. The bridge has been restored and reconstructed and is out of service to road traffic, but visitors are able to stop and enjoy this wonderful structure.

John Bryan State Park

60 campsites (including 10 sites with electricity and one teepee). This is the most scenic state park in western Ohio. Campsites are not laid out in a grid, adding a sense of freedom to your experience. With 752 acres and nine miles of hiking trails along the Little Miami River's towering limestone cliffs and the Village of Yellow Springs right next door, you'll keep your family happy for two days or two weeks.

Glen Helen Nature Preserve

Home to the village's name sake (Yellow Springs) this 1,000 acre nature preserve of woods, waterways, prairies, and fields laced with 25 miles of trails for hiking. Glen Helen's Raptor Center purpose is to rehabilitate injured birds of prey and includes a classroom area for bird study. The facility also has a Nature Shop which offers nature and ecology oriented merchandise.

Clifton Gorge State Nature Preserve

Indian Mound Reserve

One of our most popular parks, Indian Mound Reserve's 169 acres offer one of the most diverse areas managed by the Greene County Parks & Trails.

A spectacular natural resource is created with a blend of Cedar Cliff Falls, the Massie Creek Gorge, meadows, woods, river and marsh, creating an amazing view in any season of the year.

Native American history can be learned here with the Pollock Works, a Hopewell structure, and the Williamson Mound, an Adena structure, both of which are hundreds of years old. Located south of Cedarville on U.S. Route 42.

Narrows Reserve and Nature Center

The Narrows Reserve offers canoeing, fishing, picnicking and hiking through forests, meadows and ravines where you'll see an abundance of plant and animal wildlife. Over four miles of hiking trails on 162 acres. A great place for nature study, photography, and "roughing it" at one of our primitive campsites. The Narrows Reserve lies alongside the National and State Scenic Little Miami River near the intersection of Indian Ripple Road and Factory Road in Beavercreek Township, just a few miles south of U.S. Route 35.

The Narrows Reserve Nature Center is located at 2575 Indian Ripple Road, just west of the main Narrows Reserve entrance in Beavercreek. Please plan a visit to view the native plant and animal exhibits, tour the raptor aviary and the Greene County Beekeepers' Association Apiary.

Hours are 8 am to 4:30 pm, Monday through Saturday.

Fairborn Parks & Recreation

The City of Fairborn has a special commitment to recreational areas. Fairborn has over 714 acres of park land consisting of 20 parks including a nature reserve, a historical home, an amphitheater, a skate park, a splash pad, and numerous sports fields, courts, and playgrounds. In addition, Community Park, Fairborn's largest park, offers a disc golf course voted by users as one of the best in Ohio, as well as a fully paved walking path.

Oakes Quarry Park

This 190-acre Oakes Quarry Park, formerly a rock quarry, features world class fossil beds, an old-growth forest, a native-grass prairie, and miles of hiking and horseback riding trails combined with some of the most stunning vistas in Greene County. One of the world's largest and most diverse collections of marine organism fossils from more than 425-million years ago can be found here. Beaver Creek Wetlands Nature Reserve

Just north of Phillips Park and Rotary Park in Beavercreek you'll discover the 76 acres of the Beaver Creek Wetlands Nature Reserve. Entrance to the reserve is through Phillips Park, just east of Orchard Lane off Dayton-Xenia Road. A 1.26 mile loop trail leads hikers through habitats of floodplain woodlands, marsh, wet prairies, woodland pools, scrub shrub wetlands, and along Beaver Creek. The reserve is a bird watchers paradise, and a great place for nature study and photography.

Wartinger Park

This 4.3 acre historical park is a sanctuary for some of the earliest buildings in Greene County including the Philip Harshman House (circa 1803-1807), the Samuel Ankeney House (circa 1828), the John Nicodemus Cabin (circa 1811) and the Peter Tobias-Zimmer Barn (circa 1858). There is also a faithful replica of George Jarusiewicz's Cabin from 1805.

Russ Nature Reserve

Greene County's newest park is located at 2380 Kemp Road and offers 90 acres of mixed prairie and woodlands with a 4,000 sq. ft. ranch home to be renovated as a nature education center. The ten-room home will offer classrooms, program areas and a birding room.

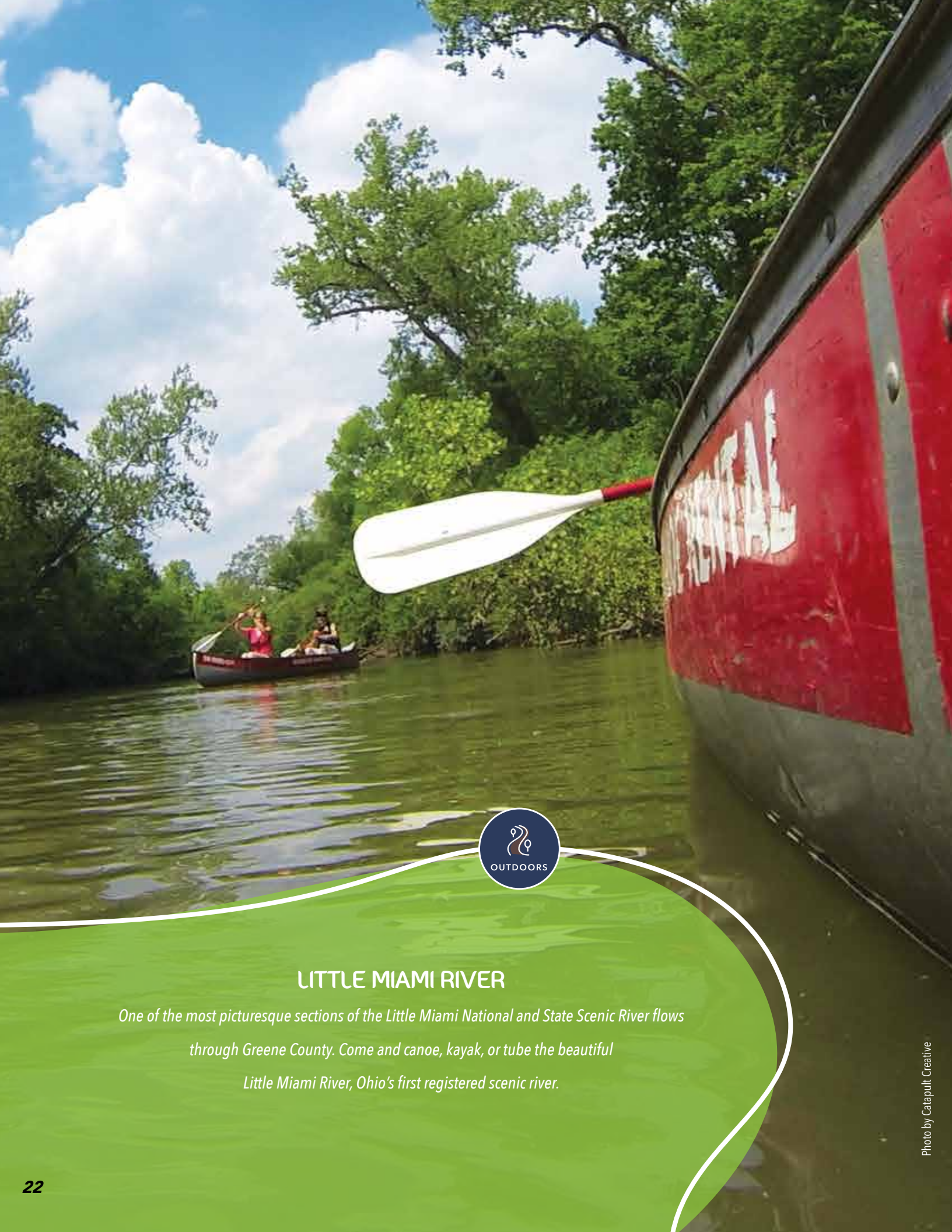

A SURPRISE AROUND EVERY TURN

No matter where you like to ride or hike, there's a place in Greene County to do it. Five trails in Greene County with four converging at Xenia Station, the Greene Trails rails-to-trails system reaches out in four directions on over 140 miles of paved trails. Over 600 miles of county and township roads wait to be explored by bike, including a half-century ride that visits all five of Greene County's covered bridges.

John Bryan State Park and MoMBA both offer off-road cycling trails.

Greene County's paved trails connect to the nation's largest network of paved, off-street trails!



Road Riding

Over 600 miles of county and township roads in Greene County beckon you to discover a serene rural landscape. Pedal through alternating bands of sun and shadow alongside the Little Miami River or race ten arrow-straight miles to the heart of farm-rich Ross Township. Ride a half-century that visits five covered bridges.

John Bryan Mountain Bike Trails

There are 7.5 miles of mountain biking trails at John Bryan State Park. The trails were built and are maintained by the Miami Valley Mountain Bike Association in partnership with John Bryan State Park. They are the only trails in the park that are open to bicycles. They are all accessible from the Arboretum Trail which is maintained by the park and is also open to hikers.

All trails are clearly marked with signs. Watch for arrows showing the recommended route at intersections. The recommended route is to start on Power Line Trail, continue on Abracadabra Trail and then finish on the Great Scott Trail. A ride of all the trails is a total of about 7.5 miles.

Rails-to-Trails Bike Paths

There are over 140 miles of paved, well-maintained bike paths for you to enjoy here with trail-side lodging, restaurants, parking and services readily available. From Xenia, trails extend in every direction along retired railroad corridors. Ride through wetlands, prairies and woodlands.

Xenia Station

Xenia Station is located in Xenia on Miami Avenue between South Detroit Street (U.S. 68) and Cincinnati Avenue (U.S. 42) about three blocks south of the Greene County Courthouse. Look for the B&O caboose. Restrooms are located in the replica of the original telegraph office. There is ample parking.

Beavercreek Bike Hub

Located on North Fairfield Road, between U.S. 35 and Dayton-Xenia Road on the Creekside Trail.

Parking, Restrooms, and Vending Machines available.

Yellow Springs Station

Yellow Springs Station is a replica of the original train station and is the welcome center for the community with public restrooms. Located at the intersection of Dayton Street and Xenia Avenue. There is ample public parking in the area. Yellow Springs was named a Bicycle Friendly Community by the League of American Bicyclists.

Little Miami Scenic Trail (Xenia to Urbana)

It is 15.8 miles north from Xenia Station to Beatty Station in Clark County. After Yellow Springs the trail passes through farm fields where you can also take a quick ride off the trail to Young's Jersey Dairy. A new trail section takes you into downtown Springfield where you can grab a coffee, enjoy lunch or stop by Mother Stewart's Brewery. You can also connect to the Buck Creek Scenic Trail going west to Cliff Park and the Springfield Museum of Art or east to Buck Creek State Park. The Little Miami Scenic Trail extends north as the Simon Kenton Trail 16.6 miles to Urbana.

Yellow Springs: Parking available off U.S. 68 near Yellow Springs Station and at Ellis Park on Polecat Road.

Beatty: On Yellow Springs Street off U.S. 68 on the southwest edge of Springfield.

Urbana: At the YMCA on S.R. 36 east of downtown Urbana.

Little Miami Scenic Trail (Xenia to Newtown)

It is 56.4 miles from Xenia Station south to Newtown. The name of the trail is derived from the fact that it follows the Little Miami River Valley. Also known as the Bullskin Trace, the Little Miami River Valley has served as a corridor of travel for over ten thousand years. Parts of the valley predate the Wisconsin Glacier, which set the current drainage system, having been part of the now extinct Teays River System that flowed north to Fort Wayne, Indiana. This section is very shaded with an abundance of natural serenity.

Spring Valley: On Main Street off S.R. 725 on the south edge of Spring Valley.

Corwin: On Corwin Avenue east of U.S. 42 in Waynesville.

Morrow: On Center Street north of U.S. 22/S.R. 3/S.R. 123.

Loveland: Any of the public lots on Main Street (U.S. 48).

Milford: Avoca Park on U.S. 50 3.3 miles east of the Little Miami River.

Creekside Trail (Xenia to Dayton)

It is 15.21 miles from Xenia Station to Eastwood MetroPark in Montgomery County. Referred to in the past as the H-connector, this trail derives its current name from the fact that it follows Shawnee Creek out of Xenia and the Little and Big Beaver Creeks through Beavercreek. The trail passes through wooded areas, farm fields, and wetlands and is known for the multitude of wildflowers. It is possible to ride through Eastwood MetroPark to connect to the Mad River Bikeway and the Great Miami River Corridor Bikeway.

**Ohio to Erie Trail
(Xenia to London)**

It is 28.67 miles from Xenia Station to the Madison County Senior Center on the west side of London. It is possible to follow bike route signs one mile to an additional 9 miles of trail. This is a straight trail that parallels U.S. 42 as it passes through a beautiful rural landscape and is well known for the variety and proliferation of wild flowers and birds. Very little of this trail is shaded. When complete, the Ohio to Erie Trail will connect the Ohio River at Cincinnati to Lake Erie at Cleveland and be over 330 miles in length.

Cedarville: On S.R. 72.

South Charleston: From U.S. 42 go south on S.R. 41 to West Mound Road (It is Mound Street to the east and Mound Road to the west.) Turn right. Station is immediately past High Street

London: At Shelter #1 behind the Madison County Senior Center at 280 W. High Street (U.S. 42) just west of Midway Street (S.R. 38).

**Jamestown Connector
(Jamestown)**

It is 16.0 miles from Xenia Station to the Fayette County line west of Jamestown. This is a straight trail that follows the old railroad.

(Fairborn)**

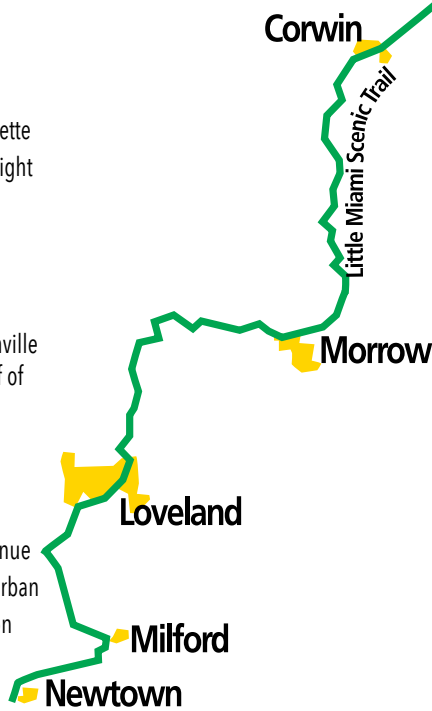
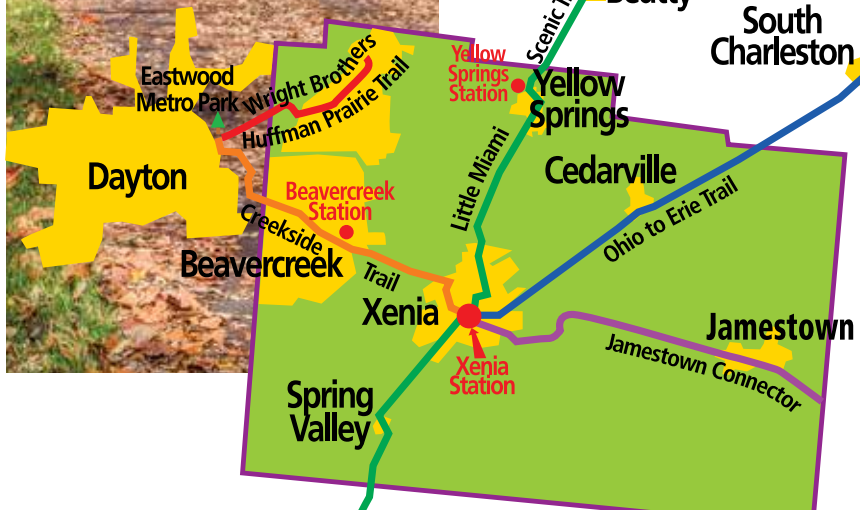
